


Roxanne Dunbar-Ortiz

is a professor emerita of ethnic studies at California State University, Hayward, the author of several books, and a life-long advocate and activist for international human rights. She will be reading from her book, *The Great Sioux Nation: Sitting in Judgment on America*, first published in 1977, which tells the story of the Sioux Nation's fight to regain its land and sovereignty, highlighting the events of 1973-1974, including the protest at Wounded Knee. A new edition of this classic book is being published on May 1st by the University of Nebraska Press.



Warren K. Urbom

is a federal Judge of the United States District Court in Nebraska. In 1974 and 1975, he presided over several major court cases related to the American Indian occupation of Wounded Knee, South Dakota and the violations of Sioux treaty rights established in 1868. He will be reading from his memoir, *Called To Justice: The Life of a Federal Trial Judge*.
